

# AWARDS

**Awards Eligibility:** Each exhibitor is responsible for knowing and understanding all applicable AQHA, OQHA and Summer Classic rules and procedures. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the awards for which they and their horses are eligible. Further, by competing for an award, the exhibitor is in effect attesting to his or her eligibility for that award. Any awards received at the Oregon Summer Classic for which the exhibitor is found to be ineligible must be returned immediately, with the exhibitor bearing any costs associated with such return.

Summer Classic awards are based on the nine-point system: if there are nine or more horses in the class, first place wins nine points, second wins eight points, and so on. If there are fewer than nine horses, first place wins the maximum possible, second place earns one fewer, and so on.

**Awards Pick-Up:** All awards must be picked up at the show, prior to the closing of the awards office on the last day of the show. The show will not be responsible for shipping or otherwise delivering any awards to exhibitors who have departed prior to the prizes being awarded. The show office will be closed immediately following the last class on Sunday for 1 hour to calculate the all around awards.

**Permit holders:** Exhibitors with permits to ride horses other than their own will not be eligible for circuit or all-around awards.

**Circuit All-Around Saddle:** Open, Amateur, Select, Youth 14-18, Youth 13 & under, Novice Amateur, Novice Youth.

**Reserve Circuit All-Around:** Open, Amateur, Select, Youth 14-18, Youth 13 & under, Novice Amateur, Novice Youth.

**3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> Place All-Around Youth Awards:** Big D Gear Bags will be given to the 3<sup>rd</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> place All-Around in Youth 14-18, Youth 13 & Under, 11 & Under and Novice Youth.

## **All-Around Awards:**

The awards listed as open, amateur, select, novice amateur, youth 14-18, Youth 13 & under, novice youth all-around will be awarded according to the current AQHA Handbook, rule #417. A horse must compete in at least three AQHA approved events in three or more categories, all six AQHA shows. Must show in halter all six shows to be eligible for award.

## **High Point Trail Horse Saddle:**

This saddle will be given to the Trail Horse accumulating the most points in 2 divisions in all 6 shows (ie: open & youth, amateur or select & youth or open and amateur or select; novice, walk trot and 11 & under classes not to count) using standard AQHA point system for determining high points. Horse must also be shown in at least one halter division all 6 shows.

**Reserve High Point Trail Horse:** Same criteria will be used for this award as for the high point trail horse. Award will be the same as the All-Around Reserve award.

**High Point & Reserve Open Rope Horse:**

This saddle & reserve award will be given to the open rope horse accumulating the most points in calf roping, heading and heeling in all 6 shows using the standards AQHA point system for determining high points. Horse must compete in 2 of the 3 events all 6 shows and must show in halter all 6 shows.

**High Point & Reserve Non Pro Rope Horse:**

This saddle & reserve award will be given to the non pro rope horse accumulating the most points in breakaway, calf roping, heading and heeling in all 6 shows using the standard AQHA point system for determining high points. This award is for one rider / horse combination. Horse must compete in 2 of the 4 events all 6 shows and must show in halter all 6 shows.

**High Point & Reserve Open Performance Halter Horse:**

This saddle & reserve award will be given to the horse accumulating the most points in open performance halter (mares, stallions or geldings) in all 6 shows using the standard AQHA point system for determining high points. Horse must compete performance halter all 6 shows and must show in a performance category all 6 shows.

**NCQHA / Oregon Summer Classic High Point Futurity Rope Saddle:**

A leather rope bag will be awarded to the high point futurity rope horse (heading & heeling points combined). This will be awarded by combining points from the NCQHA futurity and the Oregon Summer Classic futurity. A horse must have been shown at the NCQHA futurity and the Oregon Summer Classic futurity to be eligible for the award.

**Champion Circuit Award for Every Class Offered:** Custom made belt buckle

\*Includes walk/trot and 11 & under division. Schooling classes do not qualify for award. Lead-line participants receive a special award.

**Reserve Champion Award for Each Class:** Custom Jackets sponsored by Silverlite.

\*Includes walk/trot and 11 & under division. Schooling classes do not qualify for award. Lead-line participants receive a special award.

**3<sup>rd</sup> place Award for Each Class:** Directors chair sponsored by Guaranty RV. \*Includes walk/trot and 11 & under division. Schooling classes do not qualify for award. Lead-line participants receive a special award.

\*\*To qualify for circuit class awards, you must show in the respective class **ALL SIX SHOWS** in the associated division, i.e. youth, open or amateur. Points toward circuit class awards will be counted on all six shows. To be eligible for a circuit class award, you must have a qualified time, score or placing in at least 1 of the shows and meet all other requirements. You are not limited to the number of buckles that you can win.

### **Walk / Trot Division Rules:**

To participate in the walk / trot classes, an exhibitor may not enter a walk/trot/lope class. Limited to exhibitors 10 and under in age. Age determined as of January 1. Open to any breed, not AQHA approved. Circuit champion buckles, reserve jackets and 3<sup>rd</sup> place director chairs given. High Point award: Headstall & custom belt buckle. Reserve High Point award: custom belt buckle. High point awards will be award to the exhibitor / horse who accumulate the most points in walk / trot classes.

### **11 & Under Division Rules:**

Classes not AQHA approved. Classes will be walk/jog/lope or walk/trot/canter classes. Open to any breed. Age determined as of January 1. Circuit class champion buckles, reserve jackets and 3<sup>rd</sup> place director chairs given. Exhibitors may enter the 13 and under AQHA approved classes. High Point award: Sponsored by Woods Western and a custom belt buckle. Reserve High Point award: Sponsored by Woods Western. High point awards will be award to the exhibitor / horse who accumulate the most points in 11 & under classes.

### **Oregon Member Awards:**

**To qualify for Oregon Quarter Horse Member awards, you must be a paid member by April 1st to be eligible.**

**Circuit All-Around Oregon Youth:** Custom made belt buckle.

**Top Three Oregon Youth:** Custom made belt buckle (Top 3 win buckles)

Oregon Youth All-Around Awards: 13 & Under and 14-18 combined. The highest score achieved in all the youth classes and youth halter under all six judges. You have to show in 3 categories to win.

**Circuit All-Around Oregon Novice Youth:** Custom made belt buckle (Top 2 win buckles). The highest score achieved in all the Novice youth classes and the youth halter under all 6 judges. You have to show in 3 categories to win.

### **Circuit All-Around Oregon Amateur & Circuit All-Around Oregon Novice**

**Amateur:** Champion and Reserve Special Awards. To be eligible for the Amateur division awards, you must be a member of the OQHA and the Oregon Amateur Division by April 1st. You have to show in at least 2 categories to win. Amateur award goes to the highest score achieved in all Amateur classes under all 6 judges. The Novice Amateur award goes to the highest score achieved in all Novice Amateur classes and Amateur halter under all 6 judges. The Select award goes to the highest score achieved in all the Select classes and Amateur halter under all 6 judges.

**Circuit All-Around Oregon Bred Horse:** All-Around Oregon Bred Open, Amateur & Youth horse award will be awarded according to the current AQHA Handbook, rule #417. A horse must compete in the Open, Amateur & Youth division in at least three

AQHA approved events in three or more categories, all six AQHA shows. Must show in halter all six shows to be eligible for award. Oregon bred application must be approved by the Oregon Bred Chairperson prior to the start of the show.

**ENTRIES ARE DUE JUNE 13, 2009. ALL HORSES ENTERING AFTER JUNE 13, 2009 WILL PAY A POST ENTRY FEE OF \$50.00.**

**RV Procedures:** RV spaces must be prepaid by June 1, 2009. The RV spaces will be assigned by the show management. Upon receipt of your reservation and payment, a RV pass will be mailed to you. The pass must be displayed in your window and presented at the gate to be allowed to park in the designated RV parking lot. No entry will be allowed to the RV lot with out the proper pass. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

**Pre-entries:** To comply with the entry process, all exhibitors must send their completed entry forms to the show secretary by June 13, 2009. **Copies of the AQHA registration papers and all membership cards must be included. If pre-entry information (registration papers, all membership cards (NSBA, NRHA & AQHA) & entry form is not received by the deadline date, a one-time set-up charge of \$50.00 per horse will be charged.** Pre-entries may be faxed to 503-328-9790 or 503-554-0678.

**Adds & Scratches:** All adds and scratches must be made by filling out the proper form provided in the show office. When scratching classes it must be done in the OFFICE. Scratches not turned into the office will be charged for the class.

Open, amateur and youth cards must be shown in the office. All registration papers will be checked. AQHA rules for amateur and youth ownership will be in effect.

### **JACKPOT PAYBACK**

In classes having jackpot money, \$25.00 of each entry fee will be jack-potted and divided according to the number of entries in the class as follows:

11-15 entries	50% / 30% / 20%
16-20 entries	40% / 30% / 20% / 10%
21 or more entries	30% / 25% / 20% / 15% / 10%

In NRHA classes 50% of entry is added back to jackpot. NRHA rules followed for NRHA classes & AQHA rules followed for AQHA classes.

### **Non Pro Reining Saddle Sweepstakes:**

Open to all AQHA Amateur, Select and Youth riders who are also eligible for a NRHA Non Pro card. You must show in the NRHA Non Pro reining class all three days. The NRHA judge's score will count with the accumulative score determining the winners.

**AWARDS:** Champion: Bob's Custom Saddle sponsored by Drag n Fly Ranch, Home of Drag and Fly and Smart Santana. Reserve: Custom spur straps sponsored by The Silver Shop. **Entry fee: NRHA Non Pro class entry fee and office fee.**

**NRHA Non Pro definition:** A Non Pro is a person who has not won in excess of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000). Also has not given lessons for remuneration and/or has not directly or indirectly shown, trained or assisted in the training of a horse ridden astride for remuneration – this does not include prize money. Payment of entry fees and/or expenses by anyone other than the Non Pro, his/her immediate family or a corporation, partnership or other business entity in which the Non Pro and/or a member of his/her immediate family are the sole and only owner, shall be considered remuneration except for demonstrations, exhibitions or international team competitions where the Non Pro is a member of the nationally sponsored team. The horse shown in Non Pro competition must be solely and completely owned by one of the following: the Non Pro, a member or members of his/her immediate family or a corporation, partnership or other business entity provided that the Non Pro and/or a member or members of his/her immediate family are the sole and only owners of that business entity and ownership of that business entity does not change to include non immediate family members or entities.

### **Rookie / Novice Saddle Sweepstakes:**

Riders must be eligible for **both** AQHA Novice and NRHA Rookie Level 1. You must show in the NRHA Rookie reining class all three days. The NRHA judge's score will count with the accumulative score determining the winners. Rookie / Novice riders may, but are not required to enter the Non-Pro Sweepstakes. **AWARDS:** Champion: Bob's Custom Saddle sponsored by Moran Quarter Horses. Reserve: Custom spur straps sponsored by The Silver Shop. **Entry fee: NRHA Rookie 1 class entry fee and office fee.**

**NRHA Rookie definition:** Riders must be eligible for a NRHA Non Pro card. In addition the rider must not have earned in excess of \$200.00 NRHA lifetime earnings in all categories, at the start of the NRHA year. This does not include money earned in youth classes. Riders must not have earned more than 50 points in NRHA sanctioned Youth competition. Horses are to be shown one handed.
